The Why



- Legislators cannot be experts on everything that comes through their committees or bills that are introduced
- Township officials are closest to the issues and people that are directly impacted by state legislation
- Legislators want to hear from citizens
- Lobbyists are only part of the equation







Come to Bismarck

- Let your legislator you will be visiting
- Contact your Association lobbyists
- Know the bills and issues you are interested in
- Will you be testifying on a bill?



Timing is EVERYTHING

- Your contact with legislators, especially on a key township bill can make a HUGE difference
- Emails, phone calls/texts
- Where is the bill, what is the next step in the process

Legislative Process Basics

Bill introduced, assigned bill number and committee

Public hearing scheduled

- Submit testimony
- Email legislator on the committee
- Deliver personal testimony
- Watch hearing online
- Committee vote

- Bill sent to the floor and scheduled for a floor vote
 - Communicate with your legislator
- If bill passes (48 House, 24 Senate) it is referred to the opposite chamber and the process starts over

Unique North Dakota legislative quirks



- Bills can only be passed during the 80-day Session every two years
- ALL bills get a vote in committee AND a vote on the floor of the originating chamber
